

SCOTLAND WITH THE WALKERS

October 9, DAY 1

DEPART THE UNITED STATES

Depart your hometown and take an overnight flight across the Atlantic. Enjoy in-flight entertainment and meal service as you travel to start your vacation.

October 10, DAY 2

GLASGOW ARRIVAL (Arrival 1:00 p.m.)

PLEASE MAKE YOUR FLIGHT ARRANGEMENTS TO ARRIVE AS CLOSE TO 1:00 P.M. AS POSSIBLE.

After landing at **Glasgow Airport**, complete customs and immigration formalities. Your local guide will welcome you to Scotland and escort you and your luggage to the coach.

Next, set off on a guided tour of Glasgow to see George Square, filled with statues of Sir Walter Scott, Queen Victoria, and other influential people. Also, view the Victorian City Chambers, which was opened in 1888 by Queen Victoria.

Stop to visit the Kelvingrove Gallery, which was built to house the 1901 International Exhibition. The collection ranges from local historical art to even a Storm Trooper costume from the original Star Wars films.

Then, continue to visit St. Mungo's Cathedral, where the Saint's tomb is in the lower crypt. The cathedral was built before the Reformation in the late 12th century and although it's no longer designated as a cathedral, it is still a place of active Christian worship.

Motor a short distance to your hotel, check-in and settle into your room.

If we have not had time for a meet and greet/introduction, we will do this before we go to dinner.

Afterwards, we will have a **welcome dinner** at a local venue which is included in the tour price.

October 11, DAY 3

GLASGOW AT LEISURE

October 12, DAY 4, Scenic Travel and Painting

Visit Milarrochy Bay. One of the most photographed views of Loch Lomond.

Lunch at a local restaurant.

Travel to Arrochar for a look around the village, which offers jaw-dropping scenery for painting.

Dinner on your own at a local Scottish restaurant located in Glasgow.

October 13, Day 5, Scenic Travel and Painting

Travel to Luss Beach, one of the many beautiful beaches found along the length of Loch Lomond for a full day of painting. The area is renowned for its unsurpassed beauty of its natural surroundings.

For non-painters – there are waterbus and cruise options to and from Luss Pier.

A brief meeting of artists at the end of the day for the painter.

For the non-painters, there are more than enough activities to entertain you at both of these sites.

October 14, DAY 6, Leave Glasgow, travel to Glasgow with a stop at STIRLING CASTLE

Departing Glasgow, travel into Stirling and set off on a walking tour with a local guide to see the highlights of the city. Stop to visit Stirling Castle, which has been featured largely throughout Scottish history. Many grand celebrations and milestones for the Stewart family were held at the castle as it was a favored residence for the monarchy.

Continue your journey through Scotland's countryside into Edinburgh, check into your hotel and settle into your room.

This evening, you might like to dine in one of the city's lively dinner venues.

October 15, DAY 7

EDINBURGH CASTLE

A full day of sightseeing and documenting in sketchbooks.

This morning, set off with a local guide on a walking tour of Edinburgh to discover the city's many architectural styles including medieval, Georgian, neoclassical and Scots Baronial.

Along the way, also view the public art scattered around the streets of the city as you hear fascinating tales about Edinburgh, both past and present. Continue past elegant townhouses as you travel along broad streets and through spacious squares.

Stop to tour the imposing Edinburgh Castle, perched high above the city on volcanic rock and dominates the skyline. The castle has been involved in many historical conflicts from the War of Scottish Independence to the Jacobite Rising in 1745 and even acted as a military prison during both World Wars.

October 16, DAY 8

ST. ANDREWS, SIGHTSEEING

After breakfast, drive into St. Andrews, where golf originated. Upon arrival, embark on a guided walking tour of this historic town. See the famous Royal and Ancient Clubhouse, the British Golf Museum, St. Andrews Castle, and St. Andrews Cathedral.

After that, spend some time at leisure exploring around the town on your own, where you might find inspiration for painting. "Scenic painting at St. Andrews.

Head back to your hotel in Edinburgh and enjoy some free time (for painting or exploring) before joining your fellow travelers for a wonderful **farewell dinner** at a local restaurant or pub.
